2/28/2022 What God Still Requires

And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all His ways and to love Him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments of the LORD and His statutes which I command you today for your good? (**Deuteronomy 10:12-13**).

Before God sent Israel into the Promised Land, He gave Moses this summary of what their part of the covenant required. They were to fear God and keep His commandments, almost what Solomon later said in Ecclesiastes 12:13, and Peter would say in Acts 10:35. Doing this with all our heart and soul has always been the core value of God's Law, whether through Moses' or now, through Jesus Christ. Before God accepts us into Heaven, He still requires this!

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3/1/2022 Signs of the End - Part 1

Seeing the Temple in Jerusalem, Jesus predicted its destruction when He said,

"Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone shall be left upon another, that shall not be thrown down." (Mark 13:2)

[The Apostles asked,] "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled?" (Mark 13:4)

[Jesus listed many] "signs: ... wars and rumors of wars, ... earthquakes in various places, ... famines and troubles." (Mark 13: 7-8)

Jesus linked "tribulation" connected to "'the abomination of desolation,' spoken of by Daniel the prophet" connected to Jerusalem's destruction, which occurred in A.D.70. All of these "signs" were for "this generation" which would:

"By no means pass away till all these things take place." (Mark 13:30)

None of these signs had anything whatsoever to do with predicting the 2nd coming of Jesus Christ!

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3/2/2022 Signs of the End - Part 2

After Jesus gave "signs" preceding the destruction of Jerusalem in Mark 13:1-31, which were fulfilled in A. D. 70, He mentioned another occurrence, for which there are no preceding signs.

"But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time is." (Mark 13:32-33)

- 1) The "signs" pointing to the destruction of Jerusalem cannot be pointing to "that day and hour" which not even "angels in Heaven, nor the Son" can predict!
- 2) The Second Coming of Jesus Christ has absolutely no preceding signs to warn of its preeminence.
- 3) Jesus told His disciples that they "do not know when the time is." There is nothing in the Bible, Old or New Testaments, which points to His Second Coming.

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3/3/2022 Signs of the End - Part 3

Christians should expect to be "persecuted," because Jesus said,

"Remember the word that I said to you, 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you."

(John 15:20)

Though the Apostle Paul was persecuted, he said,

I endured. And out of them all the Lord delivered me. Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. (2 Timothy 3:11-13)

What Paul wrote about "evil men and imposters" growing "worse and worse," he spoke of the natural conflict that always manifests itself between Christians who are trying to get better and better, and sinners who are going in the other direction! Nothing he said was a "sign" to indicate Jesus' 2nd Coming! Sinners don't improve without Jesus Christ.

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3/4/2022 The Throne of God

Luke tells of Jesus Christ, until "He was taken up." (Acts 1: 2)

So then, after the Lord had spoken to them, He was received up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God. (Mark 16:19)

On Pentecost, the Apostles preached David was still dead, but had prophesied that God had sworn with an oath to him that of the fruit of his body, according to the flesh, He would raise up the Christ to sit on his throne. (Acts 2:29-30)

Everyone who preaches that Jesus is not yet on David's throne is denying Jesus's resurrection! If Jesus is not now on David's throne, He could not have

... Delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. (Colossians 1:13-14)

Millennialism denies the faith!

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
