

QA: Why Will God Condemn Anyone That He Loves? by John T Polk II

QUESTION: Why will God condemn anyone that He loves?

ANSWER: People have selected a few verses of Scripture stating God's love, grace, or mercy, and ignored the rest of the Scriptures!

#1: Unqualified Love Of God? The only verse many people accept is "God is love" (1 John 4:8). They think that means "God loves me regardless of how I live." They could not be more wrong, for Jesus Christ also said,

"He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him." (John 14:21)

Sinners want God to love them as they are, but David said of God, "The boastful shall not stand in Your sight; You hate all workers of iniquity" (Psalm 5:4-5). God "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4); and "now commands all men everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:30).

#2: Unqualified Grace Of God? Have you been saved by the "grace of God?"

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich. (2 Corinthians 8:9)

The word "grace" means offering someone something they do not deserve. On earth, Jesus had "the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). In death,

[He was] crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone" (**Hebrews 2:9**).

After His resurrection, Jesus said,

"Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved." (Mark 16:15- 16)

This is the Gospel of the grace of God!

#3: Unqualified Mercy Of God?

Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations with those who love Him and keep His commandments. (**Deuteronomy 7:9**)

"Mercy" means to bring help to the afflicted and hurt.

All the paths of the LORD are mercy and truth, To such as keep His covenant and His testimonies. (Psalm 25:10)

The Apostle Paul wrote, "although I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and an insolent man; but I obtained mercy because I did it ignorantly in unbelief" (1 Timothy 1:13). Believing in Jesus, he repented and was told "Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). Thus God showed mercy to the obedient Saul of Tarsus, who learned he must "declare to you the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27).

Jesus warned:

"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

(Matthew 7:21)
