GOD IS PARAGON BLUEPRINT FOR REDEMPTION

- I. Whom Does God Justify? 1:1 8:39
 - A. Paul Is Qualified As Jesus' Apostle 1:1-15
 - 1. Qualified by Savior who called him 1:1-6
 - a. Jesus was ["son" of Abraham] promised by God's prophets 1:1-2Genesis 22:18; Galatians 3:16
 - b. Jesus born of David's fleshly lineage [son of man] 1:3Luke 1:30-35
 - c. Jesus' physical resurrection from the dead [Son of God] 1:4
 I Peter 1:3; I Corinthians 15:1-8, 20-23
 - 2. Qualified by salvation ("grace") & sending ("apostleship") 1:5a
 - 3. Qualified by the saved who obeyed 1:5b-15
 - a. All Romans obedient to "the faith...for His name" 1:5b
 - 1) "the called of Jesus Christ" 1:6
 - 2) "beloved of God, called to be saints" 1:7a
 - 3) "grace...and peace" from God & Jesus Christ 1:7b
 - **b.** World-wide reputation for faith 1:8
 - c. Paul had not yet personally come to Rome 1:9-13a
 - **d.** Paul felt Gospel "debt" to the Gentiles **1:13b-15**
 - B. Gospel Is Adequate To Save All People 1:16-3:20
 - 1. The Bible rule is "The just shall live by faith" 1:16-17
 - a. whether Jew or Greek 1:16
 - b. same rule for all 1:17 Habakkuk 2:4; Nehemiah 9:29; Galatians 3:11; Hebrews 10:38; Acts 10:34-35
 - 2. The Bible rule is: Gentile sinners will be condemned... 1:18-32
 - a. for ignoring proof for God in "nature" 1:18-25
 - b. for having animal lust as moral standard 1:26-27
 - c. for not elevating lives above debased level 1:28-31
 - d. for approving those who are "a-c" 1:32
 - 3. The Bible rule is: Moral consciousness alone cannot save 2:1-16
 - **a.** those who judge others without living by the same standard are "inexcusable" **2:1-4**
 - **b.** those who feel good works alone can save are lost 2:5-11
 - c. those who now seek salvation by good morals("conscience") alone are also lost 2:12-16

- 4. The Bible rule is: Physical Judaism can no longer save 2:17-3:20
 - a. the Jews' historical breaking of God's law had helped Gentiles feel justified in also breaking God's law 2:17-24
 Isaiah 52:4-6;
 Ezekiel 16:1-59
 - b. heart circumcision, not physical circumcision is now what God requires
 2:25-29 Deuteronomy 10:12-16; 30:6; Galatians 5:1-6;
 Galatians 6:15
 - **c.** Jews who refused to hear God's Word were no better off than Gentiles who did not hear God's Word **3:1-20**
- 5. The Bible rule is: None are saved without faith in Jesus Christ 3:21-8:39
 - a. "the righteousness of God" is now only through Jesus 3:21-31
 - 1) as "the Law and the Prophets" witnessed 3:21
 - 2) as future universal judgment requires 3:22-23
 - 3) as blood-bought plan of redemption shows 3:24-26
 - 4) as one God is provided for all men's needs 3:27-31
 - b. Abraham's example pointed the way to Christ 4:1-25
 - 1) justified by works of faith, not works alone 4:1-4 Genesis 15:6; James 2:20-24
 - 2) David taught the same thing 4:5-8 Psalm 32:1-2
 - 3) justified before (and without) circumcision 4:9-12 Genesis 15:6; Genesis 17:10-14, 23-27
 - **4)** promise through Abraham was before Judaism began, and by his righteousness without Moses' Law **4:13-25**
 - c. Jesus' work shapes righteous lives 5:1-8:39
 - 1) those obedient to Jesus progress spiritually 5:1-5
 - 2) Christ died to reconcile sinners to God 5:6-11
 - 3) Jesus opened the possibility of salvation for the obedient, Adam opened the possibility of sin for the disobedient,
 5:12-21 Matthew 7:13-14, 21; Mark 16:15,16
 - 4) Jesus' death for sin requires man's death to sin 6:1-23
 - a) burial in baptism precedes a new life 6:1-4a
 - b) after baptism, sinner is free from sin 6:4b-14
 - c) after baptism, enslaved to righteousness 6:15-23
 - 5) Jesus' death severs one from Moses' law 7:1-25
 - a) if Moses' law still binding, then Christians are serving two laws=spiritual adultery 7:1-6
 - b) if Moses' law obeyed now, death results 7:7-12
 - c) if fleshly "law" prevails, sin is served 7:13-25
 - 6) Jesus' death shows Spirit's leading 8:1-39
 - a) changing a carnal mind to a spiritual mind 8:1-11
 - **b)** changing a child of sin to a child of God 8:12-17
 - c) changing hopelessness to hope 8:18-30
 - d) changing worthless to worthy 8:31-39
- II. How God Is Justified 9:1 11:36
 - A. Fleshly Israel's usefulness was limited from their beginning...
 - 1. Had been the lineage through which Christ came 9:1-5
 - 2. Are NOT NOW the children of God 9:6-13
 - a. Abraham's seed of promise through Isaac 9:6-9 Genesis 21:12
 - b. Isaac's son, Jacob/Israel, chosen ahead of birth 9:10-13 Genesis 25:19-24; Malachi 1:2-3

- **c.** God is free to choose whomever He will use to accomplish His plan **9:14-29**
 - 1) principle stated when Moses offered himself in place of disobedient Israelites at Sinai 9:14-15 Exodus 33:19
 - 2) God raised up Egyptian Pharaoh for His use in releasing Israelites, thus creating a chosen nation 9:16-18 Exodus 9:16
 - 3) the created cannot judge or question the Creator 9:19-21
 - 4) God intended to bring in Gentiles with Jews in Jesus 9:22-29
 - a) His plan longer ranged than just to Jews 9:22-24
 - b) His plan was taught through prophets: 9:25-29

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9:25-26 = Hosea 2:23; 1:10
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9:27-28 = Isaiah 10:22-23; 28:22

9:29 = Isaiah 1:9

- c) His plan needed by Jews & Gentiles 9:30-32
- d) His plan stumblingblock of Jews 9:32-33
- B. Fleshly Israel's uselessness was because of their own...
 - 1. Self-righteousness 10:1-13
 - a. ignorant zeal 10:1-4
 - **b.** ignoble works 10:5

- Leviticus 18:5
- c. ignominy of faith 10:6-10 Deuteronomy 30:12-14; Amos 9:2-4
- 2. Lack of obedience to Christ 10:14-21
 - a. God sent them messengers 10:14-18 Isaiah 52:7; 53:1; Psalm 19:4
 - **b.** God promised to preach to Gentiles **10:19-21**
 - 1) through Moses 10:19; Deuteronomy 32:21
 - 2) through Isaiah 10:20; Isaiah 65:1
 - 3) through Isaiah 10:21; Isaiah 65:2
- C. Fleshly Israel's use has ended to give them hope in Christ 11:1-36
 - 1. Paul was a converted Israelite, one of "the remnant" 11:1-6
 - 2. Those hardened against the Gospel cannot be saved 11:7-10
 - a. as Isaiah prophesied 11:8; Isaiah 29:10,13
 - b. as David prophesied 11:9-10; Psalm 69:22-23
 - 3. Their end in God's plan begins hope for Gentiles 11:11-29
 - 4. All disobedient (Jews or not) must now obey Christ 11:30-36
- III. How The Justified Must Live 12:1 16:27
 - A. Personal Power 12:1-21
 - 1. Living sacrifice 12:1
 - 2. Transformed mind 12:2
 - 3. Humility of service 12:3-8
 - **4.** Christians must be...
 - a. honest 12:9
 - **b.** loving **12:10-13**
 - c. returning good for evil 12:14-21
 - B. Worldly-wise 13:1-14
 - 1. Orderly citizens of earthly kingdoms 13:1-7
 - 2. Good loving citizens of the heavenly kingdom 13:8-10
 - 3. Clean moral citizens in life 13:11-14

C. Conscientious cooperators 14:1-15:13

- 1. Judge not matters of judgment 14:1-13
- 2. Be considerate of brethren's conscience 14:14-23
- 3. Let the strong in faith not be selfish 15:1-6
- 4. Remember the goal: Jews & Gentiles One In Christ 15:7-13

D. Concern for the Church 15:14-16:27

- 1. Paul's goal is for Gentiles to fully participate 15:33
- 2. Paul spreads Christian greetings around 16:1-16
- 3. Paul warns of those who would ruin fellowship 16:17-20
- 4. Paul's personal greeting to Romans 16:21-24
- 5. Paul's "great commission" summary 16:25-27

Roman Rudiments:

- Written before Acts 28:16, for in Romans, Paul had not yet been to Rome (1:11, 13, 15; 15:22-23, 29, 32). It was written after Acts 19:21, where Paul intends after his Jerusalem journey to go to Rome (Romans 15:23-28). It was written before the bounty for Jerusalem had been collected (Acts 24:17; 21:17-21; Romans 15:26, 31).
- There are many similarities between the books of Galatians and Romans.
- Mis-directed passages in Romans:
 - 4:5 "does not work, but believes" cannot rule out ALL WORKS, for faith, itself, if a work John 6:29. It cannot mean salvation by "faith only" for that can do nothing Cf Galatians 5:6; James 2:24. It MUST therefore mean, "does not work [only] but believes [and obeys]."
 - 6:23 "free gift" only refers to God's willingness to offer -- NOT man's effort to receive it!
 Cf 5:15-18; 6:19-23
 - 7:6 "oldness of the letter" refers to Moses' Law
 The contrast is between the new law [of Christ] and that which had become the old one [Moses]
 Cf Hebrews 8:7-13
 - 11:26-"And so all Israel will be saved" CANNOT mean a future national conversion to Christ! Because they:
 - 1. were in unbelief 3:3;
 - 2. have not attained to the law of righteousness 9:31;
 - **3.** seek their own righteousness, and not God's **10:3**;
 - 4. had hardened their hearts against the Gospel 11:7;
 - 5. were once disobedient 11:30;

there was/is NO WAY they can be saved apart from obeying Jesus Christ 10:8-13!
