

QA: Aren't All Believers in Christ Christians? by John T Polk II

All Scriptures and comments are based on the New King James Version, unless otherwise noted.

QUESTION: Aren't all believers in Christ Christians?"

ANSWER:

(1) A "brand name" only applies to the original. Examples: Kleenex is not all facial tissues; Xerox is not all photocopiers; Coke is not all soft drinks; Band-aid is not all first aid bandages, etc. It actually is a misrepresentation to use the first product brand name to refer to everything that comes after it, but is like it.

(2) It is the church of Jesus:

"So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch." (Acts 11:26)

What church? The church of Christ began in Acts 2 with: the preaching of the new Prophet, Jesus, whom God raised from the dead (vs. 22-36); the new command to:

"Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (vs. 38);

and the Lord daily adding the saved to "the church" (vs. 47). Jesus only promised to build His church (Matthew 16:18), over which He is the Head (Colossians 1:18, 24), and "that there should be no schism in the body" (1 Corinthians 12:25).

- (3) "Christian" isn't a "brand name" that applies to anything people invent that is similar to, but not authorized in, the New Testament:
 - a. those claiming salvation before baptism (Mark 16:16);
 - b. music from instruments other than the heart (Colossians 3:16);
 - c. the Lord's Supper observed other than weekly (Acts 20:7);
 - d. later-formed denominations claiming to be a part of the church of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:27);
 - e. applause-garnering entertainment, rather than, "You also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up *spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God* through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 2:5).

Not all churches or believers are "Christian," many have used a God-given name for their imitations. ——- jjttjII, July 29, 2018
